

Statement on White Christian Nationalism

At Christ Episcopal Church, we give thanks for the many ways Christians have contributed to our nation's life. At the same time, we do not believe that the United States was founded as, is now, or should become a Christian nation. Our faith calls us not to seek power, but to follow Jesus in humility and love.

We seek to form disciples of Jesus who serve the common good and honor the dignity and freedom of every person. We affirm religious liberty as a vital principle, one that allows people of all faiths—and of none—to live according to their conscience.

We also speak clearly: racism and White Supremacy are sins that deny the image of God in others. Scripture teaches that every person is created in God's image, and we affirm the sacred worth of all people. As followers of Christ, we are called to repent of injustice, to seek reconciliation, and to walk together in love.

To love our neighbor is at the heart of our faith—and that neighbor includes everyone. Guided by Christ's example, we strive to be a community shaped by compassion, justice, mercy, and abiding love.
